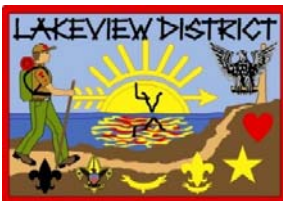
To all Unit Leaders. You will be receiving, if you have not already, a list of Merit Badge Counselors for your Unit from Lakeview Districts Merit Badge Counselor List. I know that these lists are not accurate. There are three types of Merit Badge Counselor Lists; Longhorn Council, Lakeview District and individual Unit Lists. The Lakeview District List is the Master List and considered by Council as the governing list. I, along with Eva Boy, am working hard to put together an updated, accurate and easy to use Merit Badge Counselor List for our District, as required by the Longhorn Council. Please go through your Unit list and remove any names who no longer serve as a counselor in your respective unit. If you have counselors who are on your Unit lists but not on our District list, please annotate them and the Merit Badges they teach when you return it to Eva. Many counselors were added to the Longhorn Council list, but not added to our District List, and many counselors added to Longhorn Council's list did not have a Unit or District assigned, so Longhorn Council did not know which District to assign them too. Merit Badge Counselors on Unit lists, but not on our District list will have to submit new Merit Badge Counselor Applications and BSA Adult applications. I know this is a lot of duplicate work, but it is necessary to maintain our District Lists integrity.

Eva would like to have all the Unit lists verified, corrected and returned by mid December. To make this District list work, we need the timely cooperation of all the Units in the Lakeview District.. All applications for counselors not on the District list need to be turned in at January's Round Table meeting. Eva hopes to have our Districts Merit Badge Counselor list up on the Lakeview District Website by January 15th. I know you have heard the promise before of an accurate counselor list available to all Lakeview Unit members. If we can count on the Unit's support, I promise we will have an easy to view, accessible and accurate District Merit Badge Counselor by early spring. It will be in an Excel format and can be downloaded for various types of sorting, depending on Unit needs. Units will have access to the whole District List, or their own individual Unit, whichever they prefer. The District list will be password protected and passwords will be given out at Round Table.

Please help us with this endeavor so we can maintain Lakeview District as the best in Longhorn Council.

Re-charter

All units should have received their Re-charter packets and had someone attend Re-charter training.

Remember that each unit needs to designate a ScoutParent Unit Coordinator for the unit as part of the recharter program this year. In order to re-charter, every unit must have the following positions filled at a minimum:

Charter Organization Representative (appointed by the Charter Organization.);
Committee Chair (appointed by the Charter Organization);
Unit Leader (Cubmaster, Scoutmaster, Crew Advisor, Team Leader, Ship Skipper);
ScoutParent Unit Coordinator (who serves as one of the unit's Committee Members); and
Committee Member.

Units can turn in their completed Recharter packets from 9:00 to 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, December 5th, at Crown of Life Lutheran Church in Colleyville, or from 9:00 to 11:30 a.m. on Saturday, December 12th, at the LDS Stake Center in Colleyville. If you cannot make one of those dates, units may make arrangements to turn in packets to their Unit Commissioner, or to District Commissioner LaRue Corbin.

Recharter packets must be turned in by December 15th in order for the unit to be eligible for the Centennial Quality Unit Award. District charters expire on December 31st.

Kelcie T. Nance Memorial Emeritus Award

The Emeritus Award was established to honor Scouters who have continued to be active in unit, district and council events, even though their children have graduated from Scouts. Through their involvement, they have enhanced the lives of many youth as their Scouting career spanned the years.

And Fleur-De-Lis Award

Some important points came from Round Table this month and if you were not there to take notes or didn't take notes while you were there I have captured some below so now everyone knows.

If you plan to utilize any of the Council camps and are planning shotgun shooting make sure you take your own ammo, (20ga #7 - #9 shot) and birds.

Rifle sports will still supply 22's charged at 50 rounds per participating Scout.

Archery will be charged per participating Scout

TOUR PERMITS – If you don't file a Tour Permit you are not covered by Scout Insurance. Local Tour Permits are to be utilized for all camping within 500 miles and National Tour Permits for all campouts over 500 miles. If you camp outside of our Council you must obtain a Tour Permit from that Council and make sure it is filed or Insurance will not cover your Unit. Den Leaders are to obtain permission slips from parents for local events and Tour Permits if camping.

PHILMONT TREK – Troop 937 has a 2010 Trek they will not be able to use. If you or a combination of Units want this Trek please contact Merrill Davis – merrilsd@msn.com . He is willing to work with you on the price!!!!

Worth Ranch Spring Camporee – April 9 – 11, 2010. Please plan to have your Unit participate in this exciting Viking venue.
